



ENNISKILLEN RFC – TERMS & CONDITIONS / CODE OF CONDUCT 2019/20

Data Protection

It is necessary for Enniskillen RFC (“The Club”) to collect and record certain personal data relating to each member, including the member’s name, address, telephone number and date of birth.

The data about each member shall be provided to the IRFU, the relevant Branch and other third parties to facilitate any services provided relating to the Irish Rugby Football Union’s Player Registration Programme Website (“the Website”) and published on the Website. It is the IRFU that controls any data provided. The system will be used for management and administration purposes only. Any party receiving the information shall not use it for commercial purposes or release it to any party without prior approval.

The Club wishes to ensure that each of its members (for the purpose of applicable data protection legislation) explicitly and unambiguously consents to the processing of personal data by the Club in conjunction with its ordinary business. Therefore, the member’s parent or guardian should confirm the following:

I consent to the use of the player’s personal details as set out above and for such purposes as the IRFU considers reasonable and appropriate (including those activities detailed above).

Each member has the right to request in writing a copy of any personal data about themselves which is held and have amended any personal data which is incorrect, incomplete or misleading.

Consent

I consent to my child taking part in trips to away matches, transported by bus, or occasionally by car and to take part in matches at home, Mullaghmeen.

I give permission for my child’s Coach, or other responsible adult attached to Enniskillen RFC (“The Club”) to give immediate, necessary authority on my behalf for any medical or surgical treatment recommended by competent medical authorities, where it would be contrary to my child’s interest, in the authority’s medical opinion, for any delay to be incurred by seeking my personal consent.

I consent to my child’s photograph being taken for use by the Club for publicity/promotional purposes and/or to maintain a photographic record of events at the Club. The Club undertakes not to publish the names of children in the photographs used.

I confirm that I have received and read a copy of the Club’s Code of Conduct (**Overleaf**) for both Players and Parents/Guardians/Supporters and confirm that both I and my child will abide by these. Should either of us fail to do so, we accept that my child’s membership may be ended with no return of membership fee, by the Club.

Code of Conduct for Mini and Youth Rugby Club members within Enniskillen RFC

- Play for enjoyment and become part of the rugby family.
- Respect the “Game of Rugby” and play within the laws of the Game.
- Accept the referee’s decision and let your captain or coach ask the relevant questions.
- Play with control. Do not lose your temper.
- Always do your best and be committed to the game, your team and your club.
- Be a “good sport”. Applaud all good play whether by your team or by the opposition.
- Respect your opponent. Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not “bully” or take advantage of any player.
- Rugby is a team sport and make sure you co-operate with your coach, team mates and members of your club.
- Remember that the goals of the game are to have fun, improve your skills and feel good.
- At the end of the match thank your opponents and the referee for the match.
- Always remember that you owe a duty of care to your opponents. Tackle hard but fairly, do not intend to hurt your opponent.
- Winning and losing is part of the sport: Win with humility – lose with dignity.
- As part of the team it is important that you attend training regularly and listen to your coach and help your team.
- As a team sport it is important to understand that all members are important to the team.
- Remember that you are representing your team, club, family and the Game of Rugby.

Code of Conduct for Parents/Guardians and Supporters

- Remember, young people play rugby for their enjoyment, not only yours.
- Encourage your child always to play by the Laws of the Game.
- Teach young children that honest endeavour is as important as winning, so that the result of each game is accepted without disappointment.
- Help young people to work towards skill improvement and good sportsmanship.
- Set a good example by applauding good play on both sides.
- Never ridicule, humiliate or shout at young players for making a mistake or losing a match.
- Do not place emphasis on winning at all costs.
- Do not force an unwilling child to participate in the playing of rugby. If the child is to play, he/she will do so in good time through your encouragement.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from rugby.
- As a spectator do not use profane language or harass referees, coaches or players.
- Do not publicly question the referees’ judgement and never their honesty.
- Recognise the value and importance of volunteer referees and coaches.
- Identify and acknowledge the good qualities of the Game of Rugby and uphold these values.
- Remember you and your child’s contribution to the Game of Rugby is very important to the IRFU and be proud of your contribution.
- Understand the value of team sport and the importance there of.
