In the coming weeks we have plenty of objectives, all of which will be included in our next edition. Below is an outline of just some of the actions we intend to take to improve the club.

In two weeks', time we plan to visit the FAI in Abbotstown for an initial kick off meeting with a delegation of the new board attending for a 3/4 hour workshop.
