

Code of Conduct for Parents/Guardians.

- 1. Always show respect for all players, opponents, managers/coaches, match officials & club officials.
- 2. Have realistic expectations for your son/daughter and don't put him/her under undue pressure.
- 3. Ensure that your son/daughter arrives on time for training and matches and that safe arrangements are in place for getting your son/daughter home afterwards.
- 4. If your son/daughter cannot make training please contact the manager/coach.
- 5. If your son/daughter cannot make a match please contact the manager/coach in plenty of time to ensure that they can make arrangements to ensure that they have a squad/team.
- 6. Leave coaching to the coaches. Please remember all of our coaches have obtained at least a minimum qualification in coaching.
- 7. Respect the managers/coaches decisions.
- 8. Accept disappointment, praise good work and refrain from criticising.
- 9. Support the club's fund-raising activities where possible.
- 10. If your son/daughter requires hospital treatment a parent must attend.
- 11. Emphasise skill development and practice over winning and how they benefit your child (and other children/players).
- 12. Give the coach help when asked and show appreciation for a job well done, remember they are giving up their spare time voluntarily to coach your child.
- 13. Support the coach's and referee decisions. These individuals are only doing the best they can and they need support not anger.
- 14. Refrain from contacting the coach unless it is necessary, respect they have a private life.
- 15. Failure to abide by any of the above rules can result in suspension/expulsion from club activities including matches.

Code of Conduct for Children.

Young players should always:

- 1. Treat Managers/Coaches with respect, Play fairly at all times, do their best.
- 2. Respect team members, even when things go wrong.
- 3. Respect opponents, be gracious in defeat.
- 4. Abide by the rules set down by team managers when travelling to away events.
- 5. Abide by the clubs rules.
- 6. Talk to the children's officer if they have any problems.

Young players should never:

- 1. Cheat.
- 2. Behave in any manner that may bring the name of Everton AFC into disrepute.
- 3. Use violence or physical contact that is not allowed within the rules.
- 4. Shout or argue with officials, team mates or opponents.
- 5. Harm team members, opponents or their property.
- 6. Vandalise or abuse club property.
- 7. Bully or use bullying tactics to isolate another player. Use unfair or bullying tactics to gain an advantage.
- 8. Discriminate against minority groups.
- 9. Take banned substances.
- 10. Keep secrets, especially if they have been caused harm.
- 11. Tell lies about adults / young people or spread rumours.
- 12. Failure to abide by any of the above rules can result in suspension/expulsion from club activities including matches.
