





On November 30th, 2018, the Fr Mathews U16B boys departed on their first team overnight trip to Belfast to see NCAA Belfast Basketball Classic. The teams participating in the tournament were the Albany Great Danes, Dartmouth Big Green, Buffalo Bulls, Austin State Lumberjacks, Milwaukee Panthers, San Francisco Dons, Brooklyn Blackbirds and the Marist Red Foxes.
