Adhere to the Parents Code of Conduct, help your child to understand & adhere to their Code



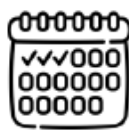
Make sure your child understands their responsibilities & the value of teamwork

Sideline Behaviour Guidelines/Code of Conduct for Parents/Guardians of Wanderers Minis & Youths

1. Help your player to learn from their mistakes, avoid vocal criticism.
2. Focus on what is going well in training and matches, not just the results.
3. Respect the decisions of the referee and your coaches.
4. Encourage to review their own performance. Actively listen to them.
5. Please contact your player's coach in the event your player is unable to attend the training session/match.
6. Please have your player arrive at the grounds 10 minutes before training and 30 minutes prior to match kick-off.
7. Gum Shields must be worn at all times (No Gum Shield = No Play) for all age grades from U8 upwards.
8. Please ensure your player has adequate and suitable clothing for training especially on cold or wet days.
9. Bad language or behaviour will not be tolerated. Coaches should be supported in dealing with this.
10. A parent/guardian should be present at the Club or with the team for the duration of the training sessions, games, blitz's, for all age grades up to U9's.
11. It is the joint responsibility of the Club, it's representatives and the parents/guardians to supervise Club players during coaching sessions and friendly or competitive fixtures/competitions.
12. It is expected that parents/guardians will assist the coaches and the Club with the organisation and logistics of away games and blitz's, including providing lifts, helping with co-ordination of tournaments and provision of refreshments/snacks for visiting teams over the course of the season.
13. Please talk to the Club's Child Welfare Officer should you have any concerns regarding the players welfare.
