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<p><b><u>Responsibilities:</u></b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Conduct themselves fairly, properly and in an acceptable manner on the field of play, and when participating in any way in the sport of hockey;</li><li>• Treat with respect all personnel, including but not limited to, Coaches, Managers, Captains, Umpires, Team Selectors and Club Officials.</li><li>• Play fairly at all times, do their best.</li><li>• Respect team members, even when things go wrong.</li><li>• Respect opponents, be gracious in defeat.</li><li>• Abide by the rules set down by Team Managers and Coaches when travelling to away events;</li><li>• Behave in a manner that avoids bringing the sport into disrepute.</li><li>• Talk to the Club Captain or a member of the Committee if they have any problems.</li><li>• Set a good example for junior players.</li><li>• Respect and act upon any complaints brought by junior players or their families.</li><li>• Follow the Child Protection Policy, where appropriate.</li><li>• Exercise care in relation to the contents and tone of all communications, in particular written communications, whether online or in print.</li></ul>
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## SENIOR PLAYERS CODE OF CONDUCT

**Misconduct:**

All members, Senior, Junior, Parents of Junior Members, Coaches, Volunteers, and Supporters should never conduct themselves in a way which may prejudice the interests of our Club, or which may bring the Club, or the sport into disrepute.

While it is not possible or practicable to exhaustively list the types of behaviour that may prejudice the interests of Clonmel Hockey Club, or which may bring the Club, or the sport, into disrepute, the following conduct shall be regarded as conduct that is improper, unfair, and unacceptable and which may be subject to disciplinary action.

- Cheating
- Threatening to use or using verbal/physical abuse or hostility towards any other participant, person or any other member of the public or their property;
- Disputing protesting and/or reacting in a provocative or disapproving manner in an inappropriate way toward any decision made by an umpire or official. Failing to shake hands and thank all umpires and opposition teams at the end of each game.
- Feigning injury and/or overreacting to an alleged breach or decision.
- Charging or advancing towards an umpire or technical official in an aggressive manner when appealing.
- Abuse of equipment such as throwing of a stick.
- Using rude or abusive language or hand signals.
- Bullying or use bullying tactics to isolate another player.
